

About Marian High School

Located on 40-acres in a country setting just south of Hazleton, PA, Marian is a coeducational 9 – 12 college preparatory school community known for its faith, family, and tradition. Formed in 1954 from the consolidation of three Catholic high schools in Carbon and Schuylkill counties, its Rush Township campus has been known as Colt Country since 1964. The school currently draws from a 30-plus mile radius, serves nearly 250 young men and women, and is supported by four partner schools, all while extending a warm welcome to students of all faiths. The gathering of students, faculty, staff, parents, and alumni from this broad geographical area and varied cultural and religious backgrounds helps to generate the unique spirit of the Marian Family.

Steeped in traditions and storied legacies, the Marian High School family is filled with passionate and dedicated stakeholders. They give freely of their time, talent, and treasure in support of its mission. The school is blessed with over 8,000 alumni, many with capacity to play a more active philanthropic role in support of the school. Over the past five years, more than \$2,000,000.00 has been invested in campus facilities, including state-of-the-art chemistry, physics, engineering, biology, virtual & robotic labs, and a STEM learning center with maker space.

Under the auspices of the Diocese of Allentown, Marian operates with a 16-member Board of Directors operating under limited jurisdiction. Committees include finance, advancement, enrollment and marketing, student life, nominating and governance, and facilities.

Mission

Since the founding of Marian High School, its mission has been, and continues to be the development of students spiritually, morally, academically, and socially by integrating the teachings of Jesus Christ with a value-centered curriculum. In a safe family atmosphere, the faculty and administration, challenge students not only to reach their highest academic potential, but also to adopt a disciplined work ethic necessary to become contributing self-sufficient citizens who give witness to the Catholic Faith.



Student Life and Activities

Marian Catholic High School offers a variety of courses designed to challenge students to develop spiritually, morally, academically, and physically while integrating the teachings of Christ. The requirements for graduation are mandated by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, the Diocese of Allentown, and Marian High School. The school is accredited by the Middle State Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools. It offers different levels of difficulty in the curriculum, including Dual Enrollment, Advanced Placement, Honors, College Prep, and Basics courses. Placement in these course levels are determined by national testing, placement tests, previous school records, and teacher recommendations. With the recent multi-million-dollar investment in its academic programs, Marian students continue to be well-prepared for the demands of a 21st-century workforce.

Recently, Marian High School proudly established the new Marian Performing Arts Program and Performing Arts Association. The association is focusing on supporting the needs of the Performing Arts Program. All grade levels are able to pursue their passion in the performing arts. Also, current high school students can connect with elementary and junior high partner school students to develop an early interest in the Performing Arts at Marian. Currently, Marian students can participate in Band Front, Concert Band, Marching Band, Rock Music Ministry, Chorus, Yearbook, and Senior Play.

Outside the classroom, students may participate in 15 organizations after the academic day concludes so that they may continue to grow to their full potential. Additionally, the school offers a multitude of activities for students. On the courts and fields, Marian offers eight interscholastic sports for men (Colts) and eight for women (Fillies) — each extremely competitive and perennial powers at the league, district, and state levels.

Spirituality and Community Service

Mass is celebrated by the school community every Wednesday morning and all Holy Days of Obligation when school is in session. Periodically, communal Penance Services are scheduled for the entire student body with visiting clergy available for confessions. Students can also approach the campus-based Chaplain for the Sacrament of Penance or spiritual counseling when needed.

First Fridays are set aside for the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament in the school chapel. Students, faculty, and staff are encouraged to visit during the change of class or lunch periods. Teachers are invited to bring their classes to the chapel for Reposition, and Theology classes meet in the chapel for reflection.

Marian recognizes the need to take extra time for God. In accordance with diocesan mandates, all students are required to attend and participate in retreat days.

Community service hours are integral to the mission of Marian High School. Students may serve their parish or Church, their community, or through the Marian Cares Project (MCP). MCP is modeled on the legacy of educational service given to Marian by the Sisters, Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. These MCP specific projects are performed in conjunction with homeless and poverty outreach programs throughout the local community.

The Position

The Office of the Principal has as its primary purpose to provide overall leadership to achieve the fullest attainment of Marian High School's critical mission. The Principal is appointed and is delegated authority by the Bishop of the Diocese Allentown, reports to the Board of Directors and Chancellor of Education, and acts as the chief executive, operating, and advancement officer for the school. The Principal is responsible for the integration of faith and culture within the school, successful academic programs, and robust student affairs programs. He/she coordinates and manages the program of supervision, observation, and evaluation of the faculty, instructional programs, and the guidance and counseling program.

Additionally, the Principal bears ultimate responsibility for the external affairs of the school to include ensuring sufficient resources, sound fiscal management, long-term financial stability, and plant improvements through direct oversight of business affairs, plant operations, and

advancement programs. The Principal ensures the successful day-to-day operation of the school as accomplished through effective delegation of responsibilities to the administrators, faculty, coaches, and staff.

The candidates we seek will understand their role in fostering Catholic school culture and have experience leading academically rigorous curriculums and co-curricular activities. Additionally, the successful candidate will have demonstrated capacity and comfort in addressing the challenges facing most Catholic schools, specifically in mission-critical areas related to business, finance, enrollment management, and advancement initiatives.

Opportunities and Challenges
